### **Horsham District Council Reports for Washington**

Cllr Beard gave apologies from Cllr Grech and Cllr Fisher. Cllr Beard reported on the following:

- HDC approved the district's Regulation Horsham District Local Plan at its full council meeting on 11<sup>th</sup> December 2023. The formal period of representation begins 19<sup>th</sup> January 9am to 1<sup>st</sup> March 2024 at 5pm for the public to submit comments.
- Cllr Beard reported that HDC had agreed her motion proposed at the December meeting to bring the Rivers Arun, Adur and Rother to the forefront of all its decision-making policies to address the "diabolical state of our rivers." Cllr Beard commented that it was really important that the voices of communities are heard and to get them involved in the conversation.
- Planning application reference DC/23/2195 at Heathside, Vera's Walk, Storrington (Washington parish): Cllr Beard confirmed she had been in touch with HDC to raise concerns expressed by residents about the impact of the proposals.
- Longbury Hill Wood: The Chairman pointed out that the woodland was not designated in the new Local Plan for development but the status as brownfield following the tree felling was unclear. Cllr Beard agreed to find out and update the council.

# To Report the decision to Approve the Regulation 19 Horsham District Local Plan and Consider any required response.

It was noted that HDC approved the Regulation 19 Horsham District Local Plan at its meeting on 11<sup>th</sup> December 2023.

It was noted that there were no new sites included for Washington in the Local Plan, including Longbury Hill Wood which had been put forward by the landowner. Land at Melton Drive, Storrington was allocated contrary to the Storrington & Sullington and Washington Neighbourhood Plan (SSWNP).

Members welcomed the news that the revised NPPF, effective from 19<sup>th</sup> December 2023, affords parishes with allocated land for housing a greater degree of protection from speculative development, increasing from 2 to 5 years from adoption. This would apply to the SSWNP which was adopted in 2019 and will have another year's status according to the NPPF changes.

Representations on the legal compliance of the Plan and its "soundness" as set out in the NPPF, were invited between 19<sup>th</sup> January and 1<sup>st</sup> March 2024. Comments would be considered when the Plan goes to examination, anticipated this Autumn. The Council **RESOLVED** that the Planning & Transport Committee would consider the Council's representations at its next meeting on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> February.

Following a discussion, the Council **RESOLVED** that the Chairman attends the preliminary hearing and liaises with the Clerk on views to be submitted for consideration. Clerk to notify PINS before the deadline on Tuesday  $16^{\rm th}$  January.

Cllr Lisher kindly agreed to rake over the bark chipping on the play area. 
